Street Maintenance Update

A major focus for the City of Tonganoxie has been to assess road conditions and implement a plan for improvements. This is a result of the sales tax election in February of 2017 that was dedicated to infrastructure. A Condition Assessment was done by BG Consultants to create a base map (pictured on page 2) to identify roads that required mill and overlay versus ones that could be treated by an asphalt rejuvenation product. The 2018 budget included the recently completed mill and overlay project; now, the City



is transitioning to an asphalt rejuvenation project to maintain targeted existing roadways.



STREETS IN THIS CATEGORY ARE GENERAL IN THE EARLY-TO-MIDDLE YEARS OF THE STREETS USEFUL SERVICE LIFE. SOME OF THE DEFICIENCIES MAY INCLUDE MINOR CRACKS, SLIGHT RUTTING OF THE WEARING SERVICE AND POSSIBLE AN ISOLATED POTHOLE. MAINTENANCE ACTIVITIES SUCH AS A MILL/OVERLAY, CHIP—SEAL, AND/OR CRACK SEAL MAY BE WARRANTED TO IMPROVE THE WEARING SURFACE, SEAL CRACKS AND MAINTAIN THE STREET IN A GOOD—TO—FAIR.MODERATE CONDITION.



POOR CONDITION: THIS CONDITION REPRESENTS A STREET THAT IS NOT BUILT TO CURRENT CITY STANDARDS (THIN PAVEMENT, NO CURB, NO STORM SEWER, NARROW WIDTH) AND/OR HAS SIGNIFICANT PAVEMENT AND SUBGRADE FAILURES THROUGHOUT. STREETS IN THIS CATEGORY ARE GENERALLY AT THE END OF THEIR USEFUL SERVICE LIFE. APPLYING A MAINTENANCE ACTIVITY TO THE PAVEMENT, SUCH AS ASPHALT OVERLAY, WILL NOT PROLONG THE LIFE OF THE STREET AND THE MAINTENANCE ACTIVITY ITSELF WILL LIKELY DECLINE VERY RAPIDLY DUE TO MORE COMPREHENSIVE PROBLEMS. STREETS IN THIS CATEGORY AR BEST SUITED FOR RECONSTRUCTION.





Tonganoxie Police Partners with the High School & **Crime Stoppers Scholastic Program**



Since Chief Lawson's appointment to Police Chief, he has been meeting with the Kansas City Crime Commission. The Crime Commission sponsors various initiatives that make our communities safer, one being the Crime Stoppers program. Our police department is now a Crime Commission member, and Tonganoxie citizens can utilize the phone number (816 474 TIPS) to report criminal activity in our community. All calls remain anonymous, and citizens are paid money for TIPS that result in successful arrest or prosecution of suspects. The system gives citizens a secure means to provide crime solving information.

In August, students returned to Tonganoxie Schools to begin the 2018-2019 school year. School faculty and administration immediately began to collaborate with Tonganoxie Police to improve school safety. As a result, the Tonganoxie High School and Police Department have partnered with the Crime Stoppers Scholastic Program. The program is set up much like the TIPS Hotline, but is overseen by a school administrator and school resource (police) officer. The student board, school faculty, and police publicize the program. Stakeholders can then approve a reward if a student provides a crime TIP that proves valuable. Kids can feel safe in giving information about drugs, guns, vandalism, thefts, or other crimes in the high school. In addition to the TIPS hotline number, students are provided with a smartphone application that allows anonymous reporting. This application is not only for reporting crime, but for other important issues. This may include bullying, social media posts referencing school violence, or at-risk teens thinking about suicide. The police department and school faculty can now react in real time if such events are reported through Scholastic Tips.

Do You Know When to STOP



for a School Bus?

- Vehicles behind the bus in the same lane or neighboring lanes going in the same direction as the bus
- Vehicles going the opposite direction on the same street as the bus (unless there is a physical barrier separating your vehicle and the bus
- Vehicles on a cross street that intersects with the street where the school bus is
- You must remain stopped until the STOP sign is retracted and the red lights are turned off
- Remember! Lights flashing or an extended stop sign mean the bus driver is loading or unloading children
