How Your County Appraisal = Real Estate Taxes

Each Spring, Notices of Appraised Value are mailed to Real Estate property owners. These values are calculated by the County Appraiser; and while there are avenues to allow an owner to dispute those values, the focus of this article is to explain how the value is calculated into the property taxes paid to multiple taxing jurisdictions. The 4-Step process highlighted below illustrates the formula that turns Real Estate property values into tax revenue through a number of taxing agencies. For the City of Tonganoxie, the total 2018 Mill Levy (tax rate) is 150.145, and below is a representation of the respective taxes collected for the City, County, School District, Library, Recreation Commission, and State.

Step 1: Appraised Value: The County Appraiser uses data to determine the appraised, or fair market value of property.

Step 2: Assessed Value: Depending on the classification of property, an assessment rate is multiplied by the Appraised Value of a property

- Commercial 25%
- Vacant Land 12%
- Residential 11.5%

Step 3: Mill Levy: A mill is a monetary unit equal to 1/1000 of a U.S. dollar, and the mill levy (tax rates) are computed for each taxing authority. For the City of Tonganoxie, the 2018 Mill Levy is:

- City: 45.326 (includes 7.891 for the Library and 37.435 for the City)
- County: 37.363
- USD 464: 65.956 (includes 5.5 for the Recreation Commission and 60.456 for the School District)
- State: 1.50
- Total Levy: 150.145

Example:

Step 1: A single family home in Tonganoxie with an Appraised Value of \$200,000 Step 2: Assessed Value - \$200,000 x 11.5% = \$23,000 Step 3: Mill Levy = 150.145 (Total Levy)

Step 4: Annual taxes calculation: (23,000/1,000) x 150.145 = \$3,453.34 or \$861 (City's share)

Step 4: Annual taxes = Apply the Mill Rate to the Assessed Value


Calculation: (Assessed Value/1000) x Total Mill Levy Rate



Your Tax \$\$\$ and Other Tax Revenues



The graphic above outlines the impact of \$1 paid in Real Estate Property Tax in the City Of Tonganoxie. The Library share is collected thru the City mill, and the Recreation Commission is collected through the School District mill. The graphic below illustrates the multiple revenue sources for the City of Tonganoxie's FY 2018 Budget. Please note that taxes (including property, sales and use, and fuel) account for the largest share of available revenue.


Public Safety Updates
