


Council Meeting Minutes November 21, 2022 7:00 PM Meeting

I. Pledge of Allegiance

- Mayor Frese opened the meeting at 7:00 p.m.
- Mayor Frese led the pledge of allegiance.
- Mayor Frese, Mr. Dale, Mr. Partridge, Ms. McCutchen, Ms. Stevens and Mr. Donnelly were present.
- City Manager George Brajkovic, Assistant City Manager Dan Porter, City Attorney Anna Krstulic, Police Chief Lawson, Fire Chief Zimbelman, and Municipal Court Clerk Lindsay Huntington were also present.

II. Approval of Minutes – Regular meeting dated November 7, 2022

- o Ms. McCutchen made a motion to approve draft minutes from the regular meeting dated November 7, 2022.
- Mr. Dale seconded the motion.
- Vote of all ayes, motion carried.

III. Consent Agenda

- a) Review bill payments
- Mr. Donnelly made a motion to approve the consent agenda.
- o Ms. McCutchen seconded the motion.
- Vote of all ayes, motion carried.

IV. Old Business

- a) Presentation of Recognition of Former Mayor Pro Tem Rocky Himpel & Update on Community Donations made in his Memory.
- Chief Lawson thanked the Himpel family for accepting donations for public safety in Mr. Himpel's memory. Chief Lawson stated the Police Department has purchased community outreach materials for the kids at the grade school and high school and have been able to hand out the materials to the students.
- Chief Zimbelman also thanked the Himpel family. Chief Zimbelman explained that metal signs have been made with some of the funds received to hang outside on the fire station in Mr. Himpel's memory. The remainder of the funds are being put towards building a training simulator for the fire fighters.
- Mayor Frese and the Council read a proclamation paying tribute to Arthur W. (Rocky) Himpel for his lifetime of public service and service to the City of Tonganoxie, Kansas. Mayor Frese also presented the family with a plaque and Mr. Himpel's Mayor Pro Tem name plate.

V. New Business

- a) Consider Acceptance of 2022 Leighty Grant Award for the Tonganoxie Fire Department and Authorization to Expend Grant Proceeds.
- Mr. Dustin Barker with First State Bank and Trust granted the Tonganoxie Fire Department with a grant from the Leighty Grant in the amount of \$10,068 for a forceable entry prop door.
- Chief Zimbelman stated the funds will be used to build a new training simulator facility at the fire station that fire fighters and police officers will be able to use.
- Mr. Dale made a motion to accept the 2022 Leighty Grant funding award & authorize the City to utilize the
 entirety of the grant receipts, in an amount not to exceed \$10,068, for purchase of a Regional Rescue Training
 Forcible Entry Prop & accessories from Forcible Entry, Inc.
- Mr. Donnelly seconded the motion.
- Vote of all ayes, motion carried.
 - b) Consider Acceptance of 2022 Leighty Grant Award for the Tonganoxie Police Department and Authorization to Expend Grant Proceeds & City Matching Funds.

- Chief Lawson thanked First State Bank and Trust in acceptance of a grant from the Leighty Grant in the amount of \$3,900. Chief Lawson stated they would like to apply the funds received towards the purchase of the So Toxa Mobile Test System from Intoximeters, Inc.
- Chief Lawson explained the equipment will allow officers to test drivers to see if they are driving while under the influence of narcotics.
- Ms. McCutchen made a motion to accept the 2022 Leighty Grant funding award & authorize the City to utilize a combination of the entirety of the grant receipts, in an amount not to exceed \$3,900, and Police Department General Fund Budget authority, in an amount not to exceed \$2,300, for purchase of the So Toxa Mobile Test System & accessories from intoximeters, Inc.
- Ms. Stevens seconded the motion.
- Vote of all ayes, motion carried.
- c) Update on Multi-Phase City Wastewater Treatment Plant Improvements Project Phase 1.
- Mr. Brajkovic stated there are two broad categories involving the Wastewater Treatment Plant including the volume
 of items coming into the plant and how we deal with the nutrient side. This was the focus when scoping out
 required improvements needed at the existing plant. In addition, the timing of the improvements and the costs
 associated were also a consideration.
- Thaniel Monaco with BG Consultants presented a staff report to the Council to update the City on potential opportunities and schedules for future Wastewater Treatment Plant improvements.
- Mr. Dale asked if inflation has an impact on the overall cost.
- Mr. Monaco stated that inflation does have an impact, however costs have lessened some and some contingencies have been built into the plan for inflation.
- Mr. Brajkovic stated these improvements will position Tonganoxie to grow over the next 20 years.
- d) Resolution 11-22-02: Approving the 2022 Metes and Bounds of the City of Tonganoxie.
- Mr. Porter stated we are required to report to the County any changes to the Cities metes and bounds annually and will be filed with the County Clerk and Register of Deeds office. Mr. Porter stated there are no current changes to report.
- Ms. Stevens made a motion to approve Resolution 11-22-02: Approving the Metes and Bounds of the City of Tonganoxie as they stand.
- Mr. Donnelly seconded the motion.

SUBJECT: Consider Approval of Quote for Provision of Concrete Approach & Curb Replacement Services

Associated with Church Street Stormwater Improvement Project

DISCUSSION:

The City of Tonganoxie CMIP and 2022 Adopted Budget included funding allocated in the City's Storm Water Fund for a significant project to mitigate storm water infrastructure issues along the area that generally parallels Church Street between 4th Street and 7th Street. BG Consultants, Inc, the City Engineer, completed a storm water study that investigated resident storm water complaints and conditions downstream from the new City library to the boundary of the 100-year floodplain. The study included capacity calculation, identification of deficiencies, and a proposal of recommended improvements. Subsequently the City Council approved procurement of necessary supplies & equipment rental necessary to complete recommended improvements to infrastructure along the corridor. To date, conveyance of stormwater infrastructure replacement and regrading has been completed on the project site by the City's Public Works Department. In order to complete the project in a timely fashion with the onset of winter weather City staff propose contracting out the remainder of the curb replacement and concrete approach reconstruction for the project area for all areas temporarily disturbed by construction activities.

Staff received 2 complete quotes from local vendors to complete the specified services which are summarized in the bid tabulation below.

The lowest-cost bid for project services was submitted by Crookham Construction, LLC for a cost not to exceed \$23,900.00. City staff reviewed the bid and consider it satisfactory & complete compared to the project specifications. Staff recommend approval of the lowest-cost bid and authorization to proceed with completion of the specified services.

BUDGET IMPACT:

The City's Storm Water Utility Fund is the proposed funding source for the project expenditures. As of December 2, 2022, the Storm Water Fund maintains over \$32,000 in unencumbered expenditure authority and over \$78,000 funds available, which is more than sufficient for meeting the cost of this project.

SUBJECT: 2022 Mayor's Tree Lighting Event Report

DISCUSSION:

Thanks to the tireless efforts of the volunteer committee, Library staff, & City staff the 2022 Mayor's Tree Lighting event this year's event was an outstanding success.

A food drive to benefit patrons of the local Good Shepherd Food Bank was completed thanks to the generosity of students of Tonganoxie Elementary School, Tonganoxie Middle School, and Genesis Christian School, with donations of more than 5,500 food items, representing about 3.5 tons by weight, being delivered by City staff.
